EYE ON THE BALL B



A grand exhibition match, the NSWCCC (National Senior Women's Clay Court Championships), the WOTT (World Oilman's Tennis Tournament), Mother's Day, busy pools and end of school year parties, **Memorial** Day, along with full decks, tennis courts and parking lots can mean only one thing: The busiest time of the year is upon us. Every May when school lets out, the Club transforms (and vice versa in August). The quiet weekdays are gone, replaced by the laughter of kids, the sounds of the water features by the resort pool, and just a general buzz all around the Club.

One of my favorite spots is standing near Court 1 during one of the exhibition matches, observing the many spectators sitting next to the court, on the Courtside Café patio and the Pavilion, then scanning towards the Clubhouse and seeing a packed Redwood Deck, Grill Deck, Grill and Bar, full with members having a great time. There is so much energy, it is contagious.

I have been in the hospitality business for 36 years, in the club business for 25 of those, and I am in my **8th year at the Club.** Having worked at 10 clubs before HRC, and having visited countless others through my involvement with CMAA (Club Managers Association of America), I am amazed by what kind of special place HRC really is. We are a vibrant and active family Club, with several generations of members enjoying their membership privileges in a club that was originally built on tennis, but has since become a full service country club (and for the record, one does not have to have a golf course on site to qualify for the country club designation). For a club, it doesn't get any better than this. I have been in clubs where the membership's average age was in the mid 70's, and they had policies in place that prohibited the necessary membership growth to sustain the club financially, which eventually led to its demise. Not at HRC! Our membership's median age is in the low 50's, and the average age of Voting Members for the last two years is 42. We also have over 400 very active members 65 and older, and over 20 active Past Presidents on the membership roster – incredible!

Many clubs wish for this type of healthy demographic. Even with the recent economic downturn, membership interest remains high and HRC **continues to go strong**. This is very encouraging as we plan ahead for another major transition with the upcoming renovation of our facilities.

A guick related update: With the input from the Renovation & Enhancement Committee, and feedback from members at large, the schematic designs have been revised several times. We are getting close to a version we can present to you for review in a town hall meeting. Staying on budget and adjusting the plans accordingly to address member needs versus wants, remains priority. Please look for updates coming your way soon, and reach out anytime if you have questions.

Here is another "something new" to look forward to: The **HRC Men's Association** and the HRC management team are working on what will most likely become a new annual tradition: A "Ryder Cup" type of combined golf and tennis tournament between HRC and Westwood Golf Club (WGC). This two-day event would include golf at WGC one day, then tennis at our Club the next day, with social activities and a traveling trophy for bragging rights. I sense that given the competitive nature of our tennis members, this will most certainly become a hit. Details will follow soon.

Did you know that our Club has strong student partnerships with the Conrad N. Hilton College

come to the Club for a tour and a peek into the daily life of private club management. As a result of these introductions, several interns from both universities continue to join our team. These students, under the wings of our food & beverage managers, are gaining the necessary experience in their respective fields of study to ensure them a successful future in our industry. HRC has become a training ground for future private club leaders, and it makes us very proud. | was recently asked the following question at a CMAA event: "Thomas, what is it about the Houston Racquet Club

that attracts so many UH students?" I would say that the answer lies in the third paragraph of this page, and that we are constantly adapting to the needs of a **changing workforce - the Millennials**. This generation has an entirely new way of looking at life (and work). I know this for a fact since my 21-year-old son "educates" me on this almost daily, but kidding aside, these needs were again verified at a CMAA education seminar I recently attended. It also confirmed that HRC is a great place to work, to gain experience and to use the Club as the launching pad for each graduate's individual career. It also showed me that there is still work to be done. But, there always is - no problem!

Summer is quickly approaching with school ending, summer camps beginning, pools becoming busy, and all sorts of other activities. I'm an advocate of keeping our kids active and getting them involved in fitness activities safely and effectively. So, I want to remind our members of the Fitness Center policies on youth participation. Children under 12 are not permitted in the Fitness Center or allowed to participate in Group Exercise classes unless the class is specific to children under 12. Children between the ages of 12 and 15 must be supervised by a parent or adult guardian, must have completed the Youth Fitness Certification administered by Club fitness staff, and be approved by me before they can workout in the Fitness Center or participate in Group Exercise classes. Children 15 and older, may use the Fitness Center or participate in Group Exercise Classes without a parent or adult guardian present. If you have any children that are between the ages of 12 and 15 who would like to use our Fitness Center, please take advantage of the complimentary youth certification that is performed by one of our certified fitness staff. The certification takes about 45 minutes and is by appointment only. Please call the Fitness Front Desk to schedule your appointment or feel free to email me at bstovall@houstonracquetclub.com or call me at 713-464-4811 ext. 142, and I will set the appointment up with one of our fitness professional staff. Or, if you have any questions at all, please don't hesitate to call or email me.

Also, I want to share some positive news on the Fitness Center's issue of controlling the clay being tracked in which has previously caused fitness equipment issues. We have tried many different ways to assist in keeping the Fitness Center clay free, but it has been a tremendous challenge to find one that worked effectively. I have good news though! We recently purchased a Treadblaster that is located on the south entrance of the Fitness Center. The Treadblaster utilizes highly concentrated nozzles to shoot crossing jets of water into the soles of your shoes. The water iets blast the debris out of the treads of your shoes. The Treadblaster typically uses one quart of water per cleaning and has side towers to prevent significant overspray, keeping your shoes, legs and clothing dry. Simply slide your foot back and forth over the rollers and push the button on the handle and it does the rest. It has worked effectively and we have received nothing but good feedback. So, please give it a try to help minimize the clay in the Fitness Center.
