BEYE ON THE BALL

Happy fiscal year (FY) 2019! For those of you who may not know, ours starts every July 1st and ends June 30th. As our **Club President, Danny Weingeist** mentions in his column, the Board has approved the FY2019 budget. I want to thank not only the Board, but also our Finance Committee and its **Chair and current Vice** President, Kathy Zay for the many volunteer hours and the extraordinary work that was done over the last 10 months with the disaster recovery efforts. Honorable mention goes to immediate **Past President, Paul Peacock** who had to deal with Harvey related matters during the last two months of his term.

After a two-year delay due to the Clubhouse renovation and then Harvey, we are resuming our tennis court renovations. The biggest project this year is post tension construction for courts 20, 21 and 22. They are currently under construction. Additional tennis projects will include replacing the fence and windscreens on courts 3-5, **8-10 and 13-15**. By the way, our capital improvement projects are funded mostly with the initiation fees from New Members. Please contact Cathy at Ext.121 when your friends are ready to join HRC.

The time has finally come. Over 200 members purchased commemorative bricks in honor of our **50th anniversary in 2015**. The path was scheduled for installation after the renovation was complete. Then came Harvey! I am happy to report that the engraved bricks are now ready and we will communicate via email when the installation will commence.

We are only weeks away from **Board elections**. This year, we will do things a little different in order to make the process more streamlined and efficient. We are implementing an **electronic voting system** to make the process more convenient for you. The most important part of this new initiative? We need your correct email address. Additional communication on this initiative will follow soon.

We recently experienced a **theft from a car in our parking lot**. A vehicle apparently followed an HRC employee from a local bank to our parking lot without stopping at the front gate. By the time security staff checked, it was too late. The employee's car had a window smashed and the wallet, containing the cash withdrawn from the bank, was stolen. Unfortunately, the camera system by the guard house was not operational at the time and no footage of the suspect vehicle is available. **New cameras and an upgraded** recording system have been installed. It is important to note that all other camera systems are operational. Security is important to all of us, but unfortunately our current system is not foolproof. On average, 700 cars enter and leave the property daily, even more on weekends. Around 100+ vehicles without HRC

parking stickers are logged at the front gate every day. Information collected includes license plate, vehicle make, destination and purpose of the visit. But due to the short entry driveway, which causes vehicles to back up onto Memorial Drive every time a vehicle is stopped at the gate with more than four cars in line,

we are forced to occasionally expedite access. Speeding vehicles and even members (not displaying the HRC tag) refusing to stop represent additional challenges. Please slow down, be patient and display your HRC sticker. We are working on improvements; however, even with these improvements, security cannot be guaranteed. Always remember not to leave valuables in your car. Also report any suspicious activity immediately to any staff member.


