My fellow members, as I write this, Spring is fast approaching. For those of you that actually read this, you may be privileged enough to do so on a beach somewhere while on Spring Break! "Privilege" is sort of a buzz word these days; there have been recent documentaries on privilege, and while I don't want to get too political, I do want to offer my perspective. First, we are all privileged to be living in the good ol' USA! I really shouldn't need to say more – just stop and think about that a second. Second, we are privileged to be in Houston. The economic run we have been on the last ~15 years in Houston isn't rivaled by many other cities in America (yes we have had more than a handful of "100-year" rain events over the last 15 years, but who is counting). Finally, I hope we can all agree that we are privileged to be members of HRC!

As a Board, we do have the privilege of dealing with first-class problems. I offer the following examples:

- Other clubs in the country have an aging membership and struggle to find new members; our membership is getting younger and new member demand is strong and ahead of our forecast the Board is monitoring to make sure we don't erode the member experience by having too many members;
- At other tennis clubs members struggle to find courts and are kicked off following their allotted time for others waiting to play; at our Club that is the exception and not the norm and the Board has even kicked around the idea of adding additional court(s);
- Some clubs have to assess their members for deferred maintenance and/or capital expenditures; our capital expenditure budget this year is just under \$1MM (with no assessment) and we as a Board get to struggle with decisions like replacing working tennis court lights with new LED lights; and
- Member dining at some clubs is virtually non-existent; we face the problem of having too much demand and the Board and Finance Committee are working to control the costs associated with making sure our members have a great dining experience.

As we look for ways to improve, I think it is helpful to remember that these are exactly the types of problems we want to have. As a Board we are challenged with creating policy to promote a member experience that is not just great, but consistently great. That is our goal and it is our privilege to serve.



We now have LED lights on five courts (25-30), which also means that out of our 34 courts, 32 have lights. That is 11 more lighted courts than 12 years ago, with lights to be added to only two more courts - 33 & 34. Member feedback on the new LED lights has been outstanding. Once the WOTT (World Oilman's Tennis Tournament) wraps up in early May, we will be converting courts 1 & 2 to LED as well. The light posts on these two courts are in bad shape, so installation was moved up on the priority list.

We are in budgeting mode. Our new fiscal year starts July 1st, which means that at this time every year, we look at our membership trends, operations, capital expenditure needs and everything else that goes along with developing a financial game plan. Several committees and the Board work in tandem with management to come up with realistic goals and expectations in order to continue setting HRC **up for long range success.** Given the incredible amount of member usage, our facilities are wearing out much faster, so it is paramount that we continue to generate the necessary capital funds to maintain our Club facilities in great shape. What is our primary source for capital funds? Initiation fees from **New Members.** As outlined in a previous column. our annual net member growth hovers around 10 members every year. On average, 70 members resign, and 80 new members join the Club every year.

The new HRC App is live. Many thanks to our **Director of Communications, Lindsey Tafolla** for spearheading this project. You now have a digital membership card to sign in at the fitness desk, the ability to instantly message the front desk, access listen to the HRC Insider Podcast, and leave comments or send pictures to management. Please let us know what you think. Also in the works is a completely redesigned Club website. Our target date to get that



Swim Team Banquet Tuesday, June 23



I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season, and with Spring and swim season just around the corner, I want to make sure that you're informed to ensure everyone has a wonderful pool experience. Aura Aquatics will again be providing the lifeguarding services for HRC. Below are the guidelines of the Child Safety Policy. I am also including the hours of operations for March and April. Please note that the Lap Pool will be open for Spring Break with Lifeguards on Duty from 10-8pm during that week. And, it's heated!

CHILD SAFETY POLICY RULES:

• Children 48 inches and under in height that enter the swimming pool area are required to take a swimming test.

· A red and white checkered wristband indicates that the child has not passed the Swim Test administered by the lifeguards. Children with a red and white checkered wristband will be issued a life jacket, which must be worn at all times when the child is in the pool area. If the parent/quardian elects for the child not to wear a life jacket, the parent/guardian is then required to and must agree to keep the child within arms' length at all times while the child is in the pool area.

• Once a child has passed the Swim Test the child's name will be added to our Child Safety Log. For each visit to the pool the child will need to give the lifeguard his or her name/member number. Children on the Child Safety Log are not required to wear a life jacket or be within arms' length of their parent/guardian.

• The Swim Test consists of swimming one length of the Lap Pool unassisted. The aid of flotation devices, lane ropes, pool walls, or the bottom of the pool is prohibited during the administration of the swimming test.

• Any child on the Child Safety Log can be asked to perform a swim test again should the lifeguards on duty feel the child's swimming ability has diminished.
